A few months after the inauguration of Joko Widodo as President of Indonesia and his promise that he would "give special attention to West Papua", this public event will be an opportunity for local human rights defenders and international experts to shed light on the situation of human rights in West Papua.

Despite recent efforts by Jakarta to improve delivery of basic services like health and education, the situation in West Papua continues to be marked by recurrent violence against peaceful protestors, severe restrictions on the civil society, economic and social disenfranchisement of the local population, and a closure to international media scrutiny.

Furthermore, the event will be an opportunity for the speakers and co-sponsors to share their views on the steps that the new Indonesian authorities should take to allow media and civil society to report on the situation, to put an end to impunity for human rights violations, and to protect the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights of the indigenous Papuan population.
